Accessibility Services

Persons with vision, hearing, mobility impairment or other special needs will find information about various kinds of assistance and accessibility at the Accessibility Table in the East Lobby of the Salt Palace.

Alcohol

No alcoholic beverages will be served or allowed at any Planning Committee sponsored event. All General Assembly events offering alcoholic beverages must also offer attractive non-alcoholic beverages with equal accessibility and prominence. No alcoholic beverages will be served to anyone under the age of 21. As a community we are committed to GA being a safe environment and all attendees are encouraged to support this goal. Anti-Racism, Anti-Oppression and Multiculturalism

In 1994 and 1997 the General Assembly passed resolutions calling on the UUA to become an anti-racist, multicultural faith community, calling us on a Journey Toward Wholeness. In 1997 the General Assembly committed the UUA to work to remove barriers to persons with disabilities. Guided by our principles and in the spirit of these resolutions, all attendees are asked to be mindful of the ways racism, ableism and oppression impact our community and the larger community that is hosting our gathering. There are numerous opportunities through workshops and other programs to expand your awareness and deepen your understanding as together we strive to be a welcoming, inclusive and affirming community for all.

Banners

Banner carriers for the Banner Parade should assemble at the staging area in the North Foyer of the Salt Palace at 5:45 p.m. Wednesday to line up for the parade. Be sure to wear your name badge. A limited number of banner poles will be on sale in the staging area. Make other arrangements for the security of your purses or other valuables; don't bring them to the staging area. Only the banners of congregations, districts and Associate Member Organizations will be hung after the Opening Plenary to contribute to the ambiance of GA. Related organizations are invited to display their banners in their exhibit hall booth or at their group's meetings. All banners to be hung in the banner display areas must be registered before the parade so they can be part of our banner protection system and must have the required sleeve at the top. The banner registration form will ask for the name of the person who is authorized to pick up the banner. Hung banners may not be collected until Sunday, from 10:15 a.m. to 2:15 p.m. in Room 151 DEF of the Salt Palace. If you cannot arrange for pick-up at the designated time, please do not leave your banner for hanging.

Children's Programs

Commission on Social Witness, UUA (CSW)

The CSW's mission is to help UUs put our Principles and Purposes into action. The CSW assists the UUA and its member congregations by facilitating the articulation of suggested Congregational Study/Action Issues (CSAIs) and educating UUs in potential social change inherent in CSAIs. After two years of studying the CSAIs, the CSW prepares and presents to the Assembly draft Statements of Conscience. The CSW also facilitates the process of GA Actions of Immediate Witness.

Cyber Café and People Finder

Delegates

After you have picked up your GA name badge, bring your signed credential card to the Delegate Credentialing Station in the South Foyer of the Salt Palace to receive your delegate voting card and ribbon. You must have your delegate voting card and ribbon to vote in Plenary. If you lose your credential card, voting card, or ribbon, report to the Delegate Credentialing Station to fill out a replacement affidavit. Alternate delegates must present their name badge and a signed alternate credential card along with either the original delegate's credential card or the name badge, ribbon, and voting card of the original delegate.

Election

We will elect UUA officers and committee members at this GA. Delegates may vote at the polling area at the rear of the Exhibit Hall (CD) on Saturday, June 27, between 12:00 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. Be sure to bring your delegate ribbon and the signed ballot stub from your credential card to the polling area. Candidates' Forums will be held on Thursday evening from 7:00 p.m. -8:15 p.m. in Plenary Hall, and Friday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. at the beginning of Plenary III. Election results will be announced in a worship service at 8:00 p.m. on Saturday evening preceding the Ware Lecture.

Emergencies

All hotels and the Salt Palace have personnel who can assist with emergencies. In the Salt Palace, the Emergency Personnel are located in the Security Office at the north end of the first floor. The Salt Palace staff has recommended that we NOT contact 911 directly in cases of medical emergency. All Salt Palace employees can assist you or you may contact security directly by dialing 6320 on a house phone. From a cell phone dial 1-801-534-6320. A roving police officer is onsite at all times during General Assembly. Inclusive Language

It is open on Wednesday from 12:00 p.m. - 11:30 p.m., on Thursday through Saturday from 7:30 a.m. - 11:30 p.m., and on Sunday from 7:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. A chaplain will lead informal Morning Spiritual Practices in the room on Thursday through Sunday mornings from 7:00 a.m. - 7:30 a.m. Twelve-step meetings will gather there Wednesday through Friday from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. and Saturday and Sunday from 12:15 p.m. to 1:15 p.m. A circle of Sharing of Joys and Concerns, led by a chaplain, will be held on Wednesday through Saturday evenings from 10:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. At all other times, the room is available for quiet individual meditation.

Meeting Rooms - Capacity and Etiquette

To ensure that you get a seat for your preferred events, we encourage you to arrive early. Due to fire and safety codes, standing room and seating in aisles are prohibited. Meeting rooms are shared spaces. All rooms are set up theater style. Chairs should be left as you found them. A/V equipment is set up by our contracted technicians. You should not attempt to relocate or tamper with equipment. Please pick up after yourself and use trash and recycling receptacles.

Message Center

A message center is maintained in the East Registration Foyer of the Salt Palace. This is for leaving messages for individuals attending GA. If calls come to the GA Office for individuals, notes will be left at the Message Center.

Name Badges

GA registration and name badges are required for admission to all GA events (including Evening Activities) except the Service of the Living Tradition and the Sunday Morning Worship Service.
